


Vendor Sponsorship 2023 Annual Education Institute March 20-24, 2023

Washington Safety Assessment of Facilities Evaluators Program (WAsafe): Building Safety Evaluations R Us

The Pacific Northwest has seen wildfires in recent years, but has not otherwise experienced a widespread damaging event for many years. WAsafe was formed to organize and train a cadre of construction industry professionals to be ready to provide assistance to local jurisdictions when they are called upon to determine whether buildings are safe enough to occupy. This full-day course will cover the basics of building safety evaluations for a variety of hazards, based on building safety evaluation programs for earthquakes, windstorms, and floods (ATC 20 & ATC 45), using examples from real events. The class will also cover response to landslides, fires, and other hazards. Students will also be introduced to the statewide process for volunteer emergency worker enrollment and dispatching being coordinated through WAsafe. Taking this course is one of the requirements for those who wish to enroll in the WAsafe program, or for those whose enrollments are expiring and want to renew. This class is appropriate for any building department staff and design professionals, as well as newcomers to emergency response and those who just need a 5-year refresher to maintain their WAsafe enrollment. How prepared are you to respond to an emergency event in your community? This class will help you develop the knowledge and skills to prepare for and respond to a damaging event. Heck no; this accessibility program will cover a lot of material and provide something for everyone. This training will focus on the minimum requirements for both new or existing construction of accessible facilities in compliance with the 2021 International Building Code (IBC) and the 2017 edition of the ICC A117.1 standard. The program is intended to make participants comfortable with the scoping requirements from the IBC and the International Existing Building Code (IEBC) and then tie that to the technical requirements from the new A117.1 standard to ensure that facilities are properly constructed. Because the A117.1 standard had many substantial changes, and in some situations address new and existing facilities differently, the discussion will cover the background, reasons, and justification for the changes. This course will also address the accessible means of egress requirements of IBC Section 1009 and the relationship to the requirements of the ADA Standard for Accessible Design. Target Andience:
