



### Code Authority if Given To


- ▶ **BUILDING OFFICIAL.** The officer or other designated authority charged with the administration and enforcement of the *International Building Code*, or a duly authorized representative.
- ► FIRE CHIEF. The chief officer of the fire department serving the jurisdiction, or a duly authorized representative.
- ▶ **FIRE CODE OFFICIAL**. The fire chief or other designated authority charged with the administration and enforcement of the *International Fire Code*, or a duly authorized representative.









### High-Rise Buildings

HIGH-RISE BUILDING. A building with an occupied floor located more than 75 feet above the lowest level of fire department vehicle access. For the purposes of this definition, an occupied roof with an occupant load of 50 or more is considered to be an occupied floor.




