
2021 WSEC-R How are we doing?

Legal Aspects of Code Administration

This session is intended to provide detailed knowledge of the non-technical aspects of building and fire code enforcement. Discussion will include vested rights, the public duty doctrine and how to avoid its pitfalls, as well as Washington State case law regarding building permit agencies. Attendees will gain a significant understanding of the actual causes of liability and will learn strategies for how to avoid them. Often overlooked or little-known State legislation affecting our work will also be discussed. This class will be particularly useful for all building department personnel regardless of experience level.

Willie has over 30 years of experience providing building code, construction inspection, building permitting, and plan review services. Working directly with building owners, architects, engineers, and developers, Will provides comprehensive building safety services such as building, fire, and ancillary codes interpretation and administration, definition ad direction of state and federal laws that local jurisdictions are required to enforce, and inspection services for buildings. The Washington State Amendments w/ SBCC review process

We will cover selected WA State amendments to the Codes including building, residential, fire, mechanical, plumbing, and others. Additionally, we will briefly discuss some of the rationale for major changes, the process to create state amendments to the adopted codes and how to get involved in future Code Development.

Instructor(s) – Micah Chappell, MBA, CBO – Seattle Dept. of Construction & Inspection (SDCI) Dustin Curb, State Building Code Council - Code Specialist will be accompanying Micah.

Mr. Chappell has over 20 years serving various jurisdictions, having been a permit tech, inspector, plan reviewer, a supervisor for both those groups, code enforcement personnel, Building Official, and in Code development. Micah is the Technical Code Development Manager for Seattle's Department of Construction and Inspections (SDCI) and part of the Construction Review and Inspection Quality Management team. He is one of the Deputy Directors of SDCI's Emergency Response Division, while serving on the Washington Association of Building Officials Executive Board as Chair for their Technical Code Development Committee. He has served on various boards and committees, including Washington State Building Code Council, and the IBC-General Committee for the ICC Codes development. Micah's educational background includes lots of on-the-job learning, added to countless hours of code training through ICC, FEMA, WABO, and a bachelors and a master's in business administration with a concentration in public administration.
