#### **Outreach Welcome**

Stacy Criswell welcomed new members and guided them to the 'Find Your Building Official' button on the WABO website to encourage them to reach out to neighboring jurisdictions. Stacy also highlighted the resources page on the website as a helpful tool.

### **Legislative Overview**

Marian Dacca provided a WA State Legislative Overview. Tim Woodard and Marian went over WABO's 2024 legislative talking points and discussed current legislation. Marian highlighted how fast bills are moving during a 60-day session and stated that there are 1,400 new policy bills that were introduced this session. Legislative volunteers will receive talking points and meeting tips via e-mail from Marian.

#### **TCD Committee Update**

Micah Chappell announced the ICC Committee Action Hearings are April 7-17, 2024 and the TCD Committee has scholarships available to attend. Micah asked for any Group 1 changes to be submitted to him or Jon Siu. Micah reported that the TCD Committee has established subcommittees, which are now able to be delegate to. TCD also has 3 Workgroups from the legislative session – Middle Housing (chaired by Shane Nilles), Single Exit (chaired by Ardel Jala), and Energy Code (chaired by Kim Barker). Micah announced TAG positions are open for the state, applications are on the SBCC website. Additionally, Jon Siu reported that you can request support from the WABO TCD committee for appointment on the TAG committees.

#### **Open Forum**

Andy Higgins reported on the SB5290 Department of Commerce Workgroup that he, Brian Smith, and Ray Cockerham have been attending with consultants to go over the digital permitting. The consultant finally understood the importance and that there is a lot to it, that it's not just getting permits out faster.




### Code Official Accreditation Program
