Agenda

The President presented the proposed Agenda for the February 4, 2021, Winter Committee Meeting.

MOTION: It was moved and seconded that the agenda as modified be approved. The motion carried.

Minutes

The President presented the proposed Minutes for the WABO Fall Business Meeting on October 1, 2020.

MOTION: It was moved and seconded that the Minutes be approved as presented. The motion carried.

Message from the Board

President Kurt Aldworth reported on the WABO Petition that was submitted to Governor Inslee's office regarding the SBCC emergency ruling to extend the 2018 codes to July 1, 2021. Kurt informed the membership that the WABO Board acted to protect the integrity of the code development process. A few jurisdictions were upset, specifically Pierce County, and the Board will issue them a response.

Business meeting adjourned at 9:15 a.m.

C & R Committee Update

Brian Smith reported the Mass Timber endorsement is completed and available through the Special Inspection program. Special Inspection Agencies are already submitting applications and one individual has already successfully passed the written exam.

Legislative Overview

Tim Woodard and Amy Brackenbury went over WABO's 2021 Legislative talking points and discussed current legislation. The focus was on HB 1150, SB 5243, SB 5380, HB 1436 and HB 1147. Amy explained the 'virtual' meetings that were scheduled and what our volunteers can expect. Members were encouraged to identify themselves as members of WABO but you are representing yourself (or your jurisdiction if you have approval). David Swasey asked to receive talking points at least a month in advance and Tim explained how that is not possible with the schedule and how fast bills drop.

Open Forum

Hoyt Jeter suggested members offer themselves as a resource to legislative representatives and provide them with your contact information.

Andy Higgins reported that it is okay to represent WABO if you are specifically addressing the WABO talking points and then as an individual on other issues.

Tom Phillips encouraged members to reach out to their representatives as a resource on code issues. Email them your contact information so they can save on their computer, and follow-up with them after your meeting has concluded.

David Spencer provided an ICC update regarding the testimony the Board heard on the IECC and code development process vs the standard process. The Board will meet on March 3rd to discuss the issue. The concern with the standard process is the makeup of the committee. The

Board is taking this very seriously and are requesting feedback from members in support and in opposition. Dave Spencer reported that ICC has been reincorporated to Delaware and the updated bylaws are available on ICC's website.

Tara Jenkins provided an update on the Spring Quarterly meeting that was scheduled to be held in Leavenworth, WA on April 22-23, 2021 has been converted to a virtual meeting.

Tara Jenkins provided an updated on the 2021 Annual Education Institute and informed members that early bird pricing will end on February 12, 2021.

Marc Schoenberg announced the Western Washington Chapter of ICC is looking to hold classes and would like input from the membership regarding jurisdictional needs.





Proclamation

WHEREAS, our State is committed to recognizing that our growth and strength depends on the safety and economic value of the homes, buildings and infrastructure that serve our citizens, both in everyday life and in times of disaster; and

WHEREAS, these guardians are dedicated members of the Washington Association of Building Officials and International Code Council, nonprofit organizations that bring together local, state and federal officials that are experts in the built environment to create and implement the highest-quality codes to protect us in the buildings where we live, learn, work, play; and

WHEREAS, our nation benefits economically and technologically from using the International Codes that are developed by a national, voluntary consensus codes and standards developing organization, our government is able to avoid the high cost and complexity of developing and maintaining these codes, which are the most widely adopted building safety and fire prevention codes in the world; and

WHEREAS, these modern building codes include safeguards to protect the public from hazards such as hurricanes, snowstorms, tornadoes, wildland fires, floods and earthquakes; and

WHEREAS, Building Safety Month is an annual event to remind the public about the critical role of our communities' largely unknown protectors of public safety--our local code officials--who assure us of safe, sustainable, efficient and livable buildings that are essential to America's prosperity; and

WHEREAS, "Prevent, Prepare, Protect. Building Codes Save," is the theme for Building Safety Month 2021, encourages all Americans to raise awareness about the importance of safe and resilient construction; fire prevention; disaster mitigation, energy conservation; water safety; training the next generation; and new technologies in the construction industry; and

WHEREAS, each year, in observance of Building Safety Month, people all over the world are asked to consider the commitment to improve building safety, resilience and economic investment at home and in the community, and to acknowledge the essential service provided to all of us by local and state building departments, fire prevention bureaus and federal agencies in protecting lives and property;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jay Inslee, Governor of the state of Washington, do hereby proclaim May 2021 to be

Building Safety Month

in Washington, and I encourage all people in our state to join me in this special observance.

ICC Bylaws

ARTICLE II — MEMBERSHIP

- 2.1 Categories of Membership The Council shall have the following categories of voting membership:
- 2.1.1 Governmental Member A Governmental Member shall be a governmental unit, department or agency <u>actively</u> engaged in the administration, formulation, implementation_or enforcement of <u>laws</u>, <u>ordinances</u>, <u>rules or regulations relating to the public health, safety and welfare ICC Codes and Standards</u>. Each Governmental Member shall designate its Primary Representative who will receive benefits of membership in the Council on behalf of the Governmental Member as determined by the Board of Directors from time to time.
- 2.1.1.1 Governmental Member Voting Representatives Each Governmental Member shall exercise its right to vote through its designated Governmental Member Voting Representatives, and shall be entitled to the number of Governmental Member Voting Representatives as specified in Table 2.1.1.1 and Section 2.1.1.2. Governmental Member Voting Representatives shall be designated in writing, by the Governmental Member, and shall be employees or officials of the Governmental Member or departments of the Governmental Member, provided that each of the designated voting representatives shall be an employee or a public official actively engaged either full or part time, in the administration, formulation, implementation_or enforcement of laws, ordinances, rules or regulations relating to the public health, safety and welfare ICC Codes and Standards. The designation of a Governmental Member Voting Representative may be changed by the Governmental Member, in writing, from time to time.
- 2.1.1.2 Maximum Number of Voting Representatives per Jurisdiction- Each jurisdiction is entitled to multiple Governmental Members, however, the maximum number of Voting Representatives for a common jurisdiction shall not exceed two times the number of Voting Representatives a Governmental Member specified in Table 2.1.1.1. If a jurisdiction has more than two Governmental Members, the allotment of Voting Representatives shall be divided evenly between the members with the longest continuously active Governmental Members receiving any remaining positions. (e.g. A town with a population of 40,000 and three Governmental Members (maximum 8 voting representatives), the two senior members shall have 3 voting representatives and the newest member shall have 2).




