President's Report

President Ray Allshouse highlighted the outreach effort of Micah Chappell to include the eastside of the state in the technical code development process. Ray also highlighted Tim Woodard in the government relations work that was accomplished and is continuing to be accomplished.

Executive Board Report

President Allshouse provided updates from the last Executive Board Meeting that was held May 17, 2019.

First Vice President

Second Vice President

Lee Kranz provided an update on the WA Custom Codes and informed the membership that ICC will be starting with the 2018 International Fire Code. The anticipated release date is March 2020. Lee announced that Senate Bill 5795 passed regarding contractor bonding and a work group will be established to consider additional safeguards for consumer protections. Gary Schenk and Lee Kranz will be participating in the work group.

GUEST REPORTS:

International Code Council

Kraig Stevenson announced upcoming ICC deadline:

• Code of Honor Scholarship – August 9, 2019.

Kraig provided a legislative overview of:

- HB1486/SB5756 concerning delegation of inspection duties for factory built housing and commercial structures.
- HB1402/SB5587 Authorizing product certification agencies to certify building products and methods of construction, design, and systems as an alternate code compliance for modern technical methods, devices, and improvements.

Kraig provided information on the IWUIC and WA state mapping and Building Department Accreditation through ICC.

ICC Region II

Gary Schenk, chair of the Awards and Nomination Committee, announced Region II won the ICC Region Spotlight Award. Gary stated Region II is a leader in the country and are doing a lot with the military.

<u>IABO</u>

Gary Schenk reported that IABO will not have as much money for scholarships to attend the ICC Public Comment Hearings and are currently looking for potential sponsors. Gary announced the IABO website has a position report that has recommendations for voting on proposed code changes and public comments.

WPLBO

Gary Schenk announced the candidate forum will be held August 22-23, 2019 in SeaTac, WA. WPLBO candidate's forum currently has 7 interviews scheduled.

OBOA

OBOA President Ted Zuk from Jackson County OR extended an offer to WABO to rebuild the relationship the two organizations previously had. Ted stressed the importance of the Pacific NW to have a unified block at the International code hearings.

WABO/SEAW

Lee Kranz announced the WABO/SEAW committee will be updating several existing white papers. Lee requested members that are interested in the committee to contact him.

<u>UL</u>

Chris Jensen announced that he is the new UL contact for WABO and has been with the company for two years. Chris reported that he was asked by UL to attend WABO meetings since he is an ex building official and electrical contractor. Chris announced UL Product Specs retires in November and is being replaced with Product IQ.

WA Center for Real Estate Research, UW

James Young announced that he has been tasked with housing affordability and researches supply and demand. He is asking for smaller jurisdictions to report their quarterly single family and multifamily permits off a quarterly e-mail that is sent out by his team from realestate.wa.edu.

Labor and Industries

Kelly Mayo and Craig Sedlacek from Factory Assembled Structures reported on the tiny home change in the state law. L & I is creating a Tiny Home 4.0 document that will direct individuals to the building department for dialogue and to ensure zoning will be approved. State Building Code Council

Richard Brown announced that DES approved a third SBCC Staff Code Specialist and he will fill the position in January 2020. Richard provided an update on the TAG committees and rule-making timelines. Richard reported that the SBCC website will be updated at the end of the month.








Draft 2020 WABO Legislative Positions

- Funding for State Building Code Council: The Washington State Building Code Council (SBCC) is mandated by state law to develop the construction codes used in Washington and that effort requires adequate funding to accomplish their mission. WABO supports continued adequate funding for the SBCC and clarification for consistent fee application by local jurisdictions.
- **Protect Local Authority**: WABO supports protecting local authority to amend, adopt and administer construction codes.
- **Code Cycle**: WABO supports keeping Washington consistent with the national model code adoption cycle.
- Underground Economy: WABO supports measures to protect the public from illegal contractors.
- **Electrical Code**: WABO supports legislation that provides jurisdictions with equal authority to develop and adopt the Washington State Electrical Code.
- **Unfunded Mandates**: WABO recognizes that jurisdictions have limited fiscal capacity and opposes unfunded and under-funded mandates.
- Seismic Retrofit: WABO supports legislation to assist building owners to retrofit existing
 seismically vulnerable buildings, in order to protect the public during an earthquake from
 collapsing structures, and to reduce the impact of seismic events by focusing on promoting
 economic resiliency of our communities.
- **IPC (International Plumbing Code)**: WABO supports legislation to reduce barriers for jurisdictions to use the International Plumbing Code.
- **Certification and Training**: WABO supports improving the efficiency of the construction permit and inspection process with training and certification for code officials and code technicians.
- Adult Family Homes: WABO may support expansion of residents in Adult Family Homes as long as they are evaluated for fire, life, safety and health standards, including sprinklers.


